RESEARCH PROFILE

Since residency, my research interests have been in the realm of voice and swallowing. I have presented at the National level and published on used of visible light lasers in the larynx. I have also been recently performing research on swallowing using functional endoscopic evaluation of swallow with sensory testing (FEESST) and have been collaborating on basic research using functional MRI to evaluate initiation of swallow.

CLINICAL PROFILE

I am a practicing Laryngologist in Manhattan, New York. I am currently in a tertiary care setting and see patients and perform surgery in this setting. My patient referral base is in the Greater New York/ New Jersey area. I offer services in clinical evaluation of voice and swallowing problems. I treat basic dysphonia, the professional voice, laryngeal cancer, airway stenosis, vocal cord paralysis, neurologic disease of the voice and esophagus, and basic surgical swallowing problems (ie.Zenkers, cricopharyngeal achalasia etc). I perform procedure both in the office setting as well as in the operating room. I have been rated well in patient satisfaction as well as by referring physicians and voice therapists in my network.
